Covey (you can download a PDF copy at with the password mem2132024* and navigating to the *class materials* subfolder). Once you read it, prepare the deliverables mentioned below, focusing on the following points:

- 1. What is Habit 1 about?
- 2. What does it mean to be proactive?
- 3. Why is it important to be proactive?
- 4. Think back to your own life. Do you think you are as proactive as you need to be? Have you ever applied the principle of proactivity in your own life? If so, what have your experiences been? If not, how do you think the principle of proactivity could change your life?

There are two deliverables you need to prepare for this assignment (you need to complete BOTH by 22.12.2025 before your assignment can be considered complete; otherwise you will get ZERO points from this assignment):

- 1. **PowerPoint Presentation** Once you have completed preparing your presentation in PowerPoint, take a printout and submit it to the instructor on the day of your presentation.
- 2. **Group Spoken Presentation (AS A GROUP, IN PERSON, IN CLASS ON 22.12.2025)** The presentation should be no more than 15 minutes.
